In the Breaking of Bread

This Sunday's gospel is The Road to Emmaus. Two disciples meet the resurrected Jesus who instructs them in the Scriptures which refer to the Son of Man. When they have a meal with Jesus their eyes are opened and they recognize Jesus in the Breaking of the Bread.

In this second year of the Eucharist, we continue to encounter the risen Christ in Holy Communion. We know him in both our worship and in interactions with one another. The sacredness of the Eucharist is not limited to the words of the institution. The Eucharist is made real in the whole Mass, from the beginning to end of Mass.

Every month, on the third Tuesday, we have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 2-5:30pm at Sacred Heart. Everyone is welcome to attend, no matter the length of time.

Many thanks again to everyone who assisted in the Holy Week liturgies, including the choir, people who purchased flowers, lectors, readers, eucharistic ministers and ushers.

As the Religious Education year comes to a close at the end of this month, many thanks to all of our volunteers who shared their time with our youth. Thank you also to the parents for encouraging and making sure their children participated.

Catholic Question and Answer

Question: I've heard that we become angels when we die. Is this what the Church teaches?

Answer: As human beings, we are both spiritual and corporeal. We are body and soul. This makes us unique in all creation. No other physical creature — plant or animal — possesses an immortal soul made in God's image and likeness. Like the distinction with plants and animals, angels have an entirely different sort of existence. Angels are pure immortal spirit, and they have been so since the moment of their creation. While they may take on an appearance of a body in Biblical history, they are not a body like we are. Angels are neither male nor female, despite the art we often see.

As the result of the Fall, human beings experience death. Our souls are temporarily separated from our bodies. However, we do not become something other than human. Every Sunday in the Creed we profess "I believe in the resurrection of the body." As Jesus was united with his body on the third day, so too will we be united with our bodies at the end of time. ©LPi

Eucharist for the homebound—If you are homebound and wish to receive Communion at home, call the church office at 634-3813.

Hospital Visits—If you find yourself or a loved one in the hospital, and would like a visit from a priest, please call the church office directly and leave the patient's name, room number, and name of hospital. Due to privacy laws, hospitals are not allowed to give out patient's names, making it challenging to know who would like a visit.



Anointing of the Sick is available on request. If you or a family member wish to be anointed before surgery, when in the hospital, or for any sickness, please contact Fr. Joe. He can be reached by calling the parish office at 634-3813, and if necessary, by leaving a message on Extension 20.

The Anointing of the Sick is offered at regular intervals in the parish and at area nursing homes.

Baptism Classes— Baptism class is required before a first Baptism. Parents expecting their first child should attend. For questions contact the church office.



The Wedding Policy of the Diocese of St. Cloud requires that you contact the parish at least 6 months prior to your wedding. This is necessary so that all the required steps can be completed in a timely manner. For second marriages, more time may be required. To begin your marriage preparation or for questions about the marriage preparation policy, contact Father Joe (634-3813).
