

Please remember the monthly Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at Sacred Heart is the third Tuesday of the month from 2-5:30pm. Confession is available at 4:30pm, followed by the Rosary at 5:00pm and then Benediction.

Thanks once again to the catechists and helpers who provided another successful year of Faith Formation.

Members of all three parishes participated with our Area Catholic Community (ACC) visit with Bishop Patrick at the St. Cloud Cathedral. Two other ACC's presented their experiences and we listened to presentations by Bishop Patrick and his staff.

What stood out in the presentations is each ACC has had similar experiences, the most common issue was communication. What I brought home from the experience is I am thankful we have only three parishes in our ACC, some have 6 or more.

Those ACC's with as many as 6 parishes are struggling, even if they have two priests and one or more deacons. These clusters are too large to manage and in the process people are losing their sense of church as a community.

I hope Bishop Patrick will listen to people's concerns and reverse course. The Bishop seems to be aware of and admits that at some point we will need to close parishes. In the western part of the diocese we have already closed several churches. In this area we have closed Sedan and Padua, and Brooten no longer has a weekend Mass. Previously closed in Traverse County were Barry, Collis, Dumont and Donnelly (Grant County). It is time for Stearns county and the St. Cloud area to shoulder their part of the burden.

# May Crowning...what's it all about anyway?

May crowning does not have a set date and can be celebrated at any time during the month of May. Some churches opt for Mother's Day, while others do it as soon as the calendar turns to May. Recently however, Pope Francis chose to add the day to the liturgical calendar, placing it the day after Pentecost.

There is no set ritual, but May crownings are celebrated during Mass and include a procession, a crown of flowers and herbs which are placed on the head of the statue of Mary. Other flowers are placed at her feet. The flowers are usually replaced throughout the month to keep them fresh.

While Mary the Mother of God is revered and celebrated all year long, May has been Mary's month since the medieval period. May was considered the end of winter and the start of a new season of growth. It's a time for new beginnings and chance to begin with gratitude and devotion.

### **Catholic Question and Answer**

**Question:** My neighbor is just beginning to explore the Catholic faith but was raised agnostic. I grew up believ-

ing in God, praying, and attending Mass. How does one start from scratch as an adult to develop a relationship with God?

Answer: Start on a personal level! How did you and your neighbor become friends? How did you begin to discuss such a personal topic as faith? Communication, spending time together, and getting to know each other are essential to forming the bonds of a relationship. Personal prayer is essential to our relationship with God. We can't be close to someone we don't know! Invite your friend to explore the stories of Jesus in the Bible. Introduce them to the lives of the saints, especially ones you think they might be interested in.

Your neighbor might also have questions about the Catholic faith that you don't know how to answer. If your friend hasn't yet enrolled in RCIA classes, invite them to Mass at your parish. Introduce your friend to the faith formation director to make a connection. Personal support can be helpful as well, especially if few of your neighbor's current friends are practicing their faith. Connect your neighbor to other people in your parish living their faith well. The good examples of other faithful people could help your neighbor to feel welcomed and supported. Hospital Visits—If you find yourself or a loved one in the hospital, and would like a visit from a priest, please call the church office directly and leave the patient's name, room number, and name of hospital. Due to privacy laws, hospitals are not allowed to give out patient's names, making it challenging to know who would like a visit.



Anointing of the Sick is available on request. If you or a family member wish to be anointed before surgery, when in the hospital, or for any sickness, please

contact Fr. Joe. He can be reached by calling the parish office at 634-3813, and if necessary, by leaving a message on Extension 20.

The Anointing of the Sick is offered at regular intervals in the parish and at area nursing homes.

**Baptism Classes**— Baptism class is required before a first Baptism. Parents expecting their first child should attend. For questions contact the church office.



The Wedding Policy of the Diocese of St. Cloud

requires that you contact the parish at least 6 months prior to your wedding. This is necessary so that all the required steps can be completed in a timely manner. For second marriages, more time may be required. To begin your marriage preparation or for questions about the marriage preparation policy, contact Father Joe (634-3813).
