

# HAPPY EASTER

Easter is the most important day in the church's calendar because it is the day Jesus rose from the grave. By his death and resurrection we have received forgiveness of our sins and the promise of eternal life.

When I hear of disasters such as the recent earthquake in Myanmar, and the great loss of life, I wonder how does God deal with so many souls? Every year I remember the Titanic sinking on April 15, 1912. More than 1,500 souls were lost mostly due to human error. The enormous loss of life is overwhelming.

I am comforted to know that even though we mourn the death of our loved ones, they are in the hands of God. As we read in the gospel of John 14, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God, have faith also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places."

In Acts 10, we read, "All the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in Christ will receive forgiveness through his name."

This is the good news of Easter and what we celebrate each year and at every Eucharist.

It is easy to get distracted by the pettiness of human life. Those causes we hold most dear, whether political identities or material possessions, are of least importance in the grand scheme of life. What matters is how well we live our faith in the Lord, and trust God can renew all things.

# Everyday Stewardship

Leave It in the Tomb Today, on the most important day of the liturgical year, the Apostle Paul is calling us out.

"I see you hiding in that tomb," he says. "I see you baking with that old, stale yeast, thinking no one will notice."

He says it a little more elegantly, I'll grant you. But the message is this: If you want to be raised with Christ, you'd better be ready to step out of the shadows. Seek what is above — not what is on earth.

I can feel myself responding almost reflexively, "Great idea, Paul — but I'm pretty comfy here." Because sometimes, it's just easier to stay in the tomb. It's easier to crouch in the shadows and look outward at everyone else, thinking of the changes they could make or the sins they could overcome.

Today we are called to embrace newness. New hearts, new lives, new futures, new chances. If there's anything keeping you from that, you need to leave it in the tomb. It's a little scary, sure — maybe Jesus thought so before he stepped into the light of that first Easter morning. But no loaf of bread worth eating was ever baked using stale yeast that wouldn't rise. No new life worth having was ever lived through the broken sins of yesterday. No Easter morning ever dawned without the tomb sitting empty.

Step into the light. He is waiting for you.

Knight of Columbus Tootsie Rolls will be available the weekend of April 26/27!



The Anointing of the Sick is offered at regular intervals in the parish and at area nursing homes.

The Wedding Policy of the Diocese of St. Cloud

requires that you contact the parish at least 6 months prior to your wedding. This is necessary so that all the required steps can be completed in a timely manner. For second marriages, more time may be required. To begin your marriage preparation or for questions about the marriage preparation policy, contact Father Joe (634-3813).
